President Stieneke introduced representatives from the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department. The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department is studying the benefits of accreditation for their agency.

Sue Wales, Accreditation Manager for the Salisbury Police Department, welcomed those in attendance to Salisbury.

Salisbury Police Chief Chris Herring welcomed everyone in attendance and encouraged everyone to maintain the commitment to the high standards of accreditation.

Secretary Mark Brooks presented the minutes from the June 2002 meeting held at the North Carolina State Highway Patrol Troop C Headquarters in Raleigh, N.C. Motion was made to revise the minutes to show the North Carolina State University Police in attendance. Motion made to accept minutes as revised. Revised minutes were approved.

Treasurer Rick Buchanan reported a balance of \$15,564.15 in the NCLEAN account. The treasurer's report was given and approved.

Old Business

Discussion was held on the July 9th Triangle Bone Marrow Drive, sponsored by Triangle Public Safety Agencies. The drive resulted in 96 donors being typed. At this point, no results have been released concerning matches from donors. President Stieneke thanked everyone for their help. Captain Mark Brooks provided an update on Chief Charlie Vanhoy's condition.

There was a brief discussion on the July CALEA conference held in Cleveland, Ohio. The two new standards from Chapter 46 were adopted at the conference. No NCLEAN agencies went before the commission at the conference.

New Business

Discussion was held on updating the list that has been distributed in the past that gives relevant Statutes and other documentation for specific accreditation standards. Sergeant Teia Poulin asked for volunteers to help her as she begins working on this project. Captain Richard Buchanan volunteered to assist with this project. Sergeant Poulin stated that the NC State Highway Patrol has purchased the *Total Accreditation Management and Evaluation Program* (TAME) and she will be working with the program to see if it will provide assistance with this project.
